How will I be assessed?

- **Formative:** Weekly writing exercises, peer feedback sessions, and online discussions will help you hone your craft and receive constructive criticism.
- **Summative:** A final portfolio submission consisting of original creative writing pieces in a chosen genre, showcasing your understanding of the course concepts and your progress as a writer.

Who is this course for?

This course is open to anyone with a passion for storytelling and a desire to develop their creative writing skills.

Who is your target audience?

This course is designed for learners hoping to develop a new level of understanding and practical skills in creative writing. It caters to those who want to explore different writing styles, learn effective storytelling techniques, and gain the confidence to share their work. **Progression Opportunities:**

Please bring a notepad, and pen to each session. You may wish to bring a file for any handouts. A laptop with internet access is required for completion of coursework and home learning outside of the classroom.
