Course Description:

What will I learn?

- **Week 7 & 8:** Film Analysis & Critical Viewing - Develop your skills in analysing films, discuss the influence of directors and movements, and learn how to critically evaluate the messages and themes portrayed on screen.

How will I be assessed?

- **Formative:** Online quizzes, film analysis activities, and discussion forums will test your understanding and encourage critical thinking about film.
- **Summative:** A final project where you analyse a chosen film in depth, exploring its technical aspects, narrative techniques, and cultural significance. (139 characters)

Who is this course for?

This course is open to anyone with a love for movies and a desire to learn more about the world of cinema.

Who is your target audience?

This course is designed for learners hoping to develop a new level of understanding and appreciation for film. It caters to those who want to explore the history and technical aspects of filmmaking, analyse different genres and storytelling techniques, and become more critical viewers.

Please bring a notepad, and pen to each session. You may wish to bring a file for any handouts. A laptop with internet access is required for completion of coursework and home learning outside of the classroom.
