Entry requirements

How to become a confident online user, with the ever changing ways of the commercial and retail world online shopping and banking has become a normal part of life. You will explore how to shop and bank online, as well as being able to book holidays, trips, concerts and much more with confidence. Support any fears regarding online safety, fraud and internet misuse. Teaching you how to stay safe online, so you are confident when using digital devices on the internet. This will be ongoing throughout out each session of the course, frequently discussing about how to protect yourself and others from problems that can occur while using the internet in an unsafe way.

How will the course be delivered?

You will be working with your tutor and other students on a weekly basis, face to face.

Your tutor will set objectives and give feedback on how you are progressing. You will agree personal targets as part of your Individual Learning Plan (ILP), and you will review your targets throughout the course to check your own progress.
