Whether you're looking after your own online safety, or want to equip vulnerable individuals you work with as a volunteer or carer, this course provides the tools you need to stay safe online.

What will I learn?

- Understanding common online scams (phishing, identity theft etc.)
- Protecting your personal information online
- Creating strong passwords and practising safe browsing habits
- Identifying suspicious emails and online content
- Strategies for online safety and fraud prevention

How will I be assessed?

- **Formative assessment:** Participation in discussions, group activities, and simulated phishing exercises will allow for continuous feedback and skill development.
- Summative assessment: A short quiz will gauge your understanding of key online safety principles.

Who is this course for?

This course is designed for anyone who wants to improve their online safety, including those concerned about personal security, volunteers supporting vulnerable individuals, and carers looking to safeguard those they care for.

Progression Opportunities:

Following this course, you can broaden your digital literacy skills by enrolling in a variety of programs, such as:

- Level 2 Certificate in Online Safety
- Level 3 Diploma in Digital Literacy
- Level 3 Award in Cyber Security Awareness

Career or Job Enhancement Pathways:

This course can complement various roles where online safety is important, such as:

- Digital Skills Trainer
- Community Outreach Worker (Digital Inclusion)
- Data Protection Officer (for relevant organisations)
- IT Support Specialist (user awareness training)

How will I know I'm making progress?

During the first session, your tutor will discuss your goals and current level in relation to the course. Based on this assessment, you will agree individual targets which you will record in your individual learning plan (ILP). You and your tutor will review your targets regularly to ensure that you are making progress; these will be written in your individual learning plan.

What will I need?

Please bring a notepad, and pen to each session. You may wish to bring a file for any handouts. A laptop with internet access is required for completion of coursework and home learning outside of the classroom.

Please note:

Most courses attract a subsidy from the Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA).
