- **Week 5 & 6:** Constructing a fully lined tote bag with internal pockets, mastering tote bag construction, and exploring buttonhole creation.

Progression Opportunities:

Upon completion, you can elevate your skills with more advanced sewing courses, exploring intricate designs and specialised techniques. Further your sewing journey with dressmaking, soft furnishing, or tailoring courses, expanding your creative horizons.

You and your tutor will review your targets regularly to ensure that you are making progress; these will be written in your individual learning plan.
