Awareness LGBT History Month



Course Description:

Short workshop dedicated to LGBT+ History Month 2025. This course enables learners to develop their knowledge of LGBT+ key terms, the associated symbols and flags, early and modern history of LGBT+ community and the milestones in acceptance and development of LGBT+ rights within the UK.

What Will I Learn?

What is LGBT+?

The definition of LGBT+ key terms, sexualities, discussion around gender acceptance and identity.

Symbols/flags:

The definition of different symbols and flags associated with the LGBT+ community and why these symbols/flags are important to acceptance and rights within society.

Early and modern LGBT+ history:

Learn about the early insights into LGBT+ history and key historic movements such as The Stonewall Uprising, The Gay Liberation Movement and The AIDS Crisis.

Milestones in LGBT+ rights:

Learn about milestones such as same sex marriage announcements, transgender rights movement, changes to access to healthcare and legal recognition.
