This qualification will not teach or qualify candidates to be Counsellors, but it will help them decide whether or not they want to train as a Counsellor. It will also give them counselling skills that are useful in a variety of roles e.g. care assistant, key worker, support worker.

You will need to take an online initial assessment to understand your levels of English and Maths prior to entry on this course.

Entry requirements While previous completion of an Introduction to Counselling Skills course is recommended, no prior experience of counselling is required. Enthusiasm, commitment, and a willingness to be open and share the learning process with others are important qualities.

You will need to demonstrate full commitment and willingness to reflect on your personal skills and engage with some abstract concepts of counselling.

This course is not a substitute for therapy. Students need to be emotionally resilient, and if you are currently experiencing serious difficulties in your life, it would be advisable to delay starting this course until these are resolved.

Course Intent

This qualification is for:

- Those starting the first level of training towards becoming a professional Counsellor
- Those who want to learn counselling skills to support other professional or helping roles
- Those who want to improve their professional and personal relationships as part of personal development.

This qualification is designed to give learners the underpinning knowledge, skills and competencies to use counselling skills ethically and safely in a variety of contexts and roles, and will concentrate on developing students' counselling skills, following seven units of study which are based on the process of the CPCAB model:

- Use counselling skills ethically and safely
- Manage helping interaction
- Communicate empathetic understanding
- Manage an active listening space
- Use self-awareness to facilitate helping work
- Use counselling skills in a consistent and logical way
- Use study skills to help manage learning

How will I learn?

During the first session your tutor will outline what will be covered during the course. You can then think about your individual aims for the course and make an individual learning plan, with the help of the tutor.

This is a mainly theory course with some practical aspects and group discussion.

How will I know I'm making progress?

Your tutor will set objectives for each session and give feedback on how you are progressing. You will agree personal targets as part of your Individual Learning Plan (ILP), and you will review your targets throughout the course to check your own progress.

You will complete assignments with deadlines, these will be assessed regularly, and feedback given to support your portfolio of work, required to meet the standards.

Will I need to study or practise outside the classroom?

There is a considerable amount of work for you to do in your own time for this qualification. Please allow a minimum of 3 hours per week for this. There will be formal assignments which may include essays, research, reading or preparing presentations.

What will I need for the course?

Please bring a pen, notepad and folder.
