Entry requirements There are no entry requirements, this course is for complete beginners. People with a limited amount of knowledge on the subject may join this course to refresh their knowledge.

Tell me about the course. During this course you will learn how to use a range of carpentry tools and safe working practices within the workshop. You will be supported to design, create and complete a basic carpentry project, under the direction of your tutor.

Topics covered on the course will include:

Identification of tools and materials.

Tool maintenance.

Use of glue and fixings.

Basic woodworking joints.

Selection of appropriate timber.

You will be required to evidence each stage of your project to support your qualification.

The awarding body for this qualification is NCFE CACHE.

How will I learn? This is a practical course and the sessions will include tutor-led demonstrations, learner-led activities, instruction and repetition. These will form part of the delivery together with one-to-one support as required.

How will I know I'm making progress? During the first session, your tutor will discuss your goals and current level in relation to the course. Based on this assessment, you will agree individual targets which you will record in your individual learning plan. You will review your targets regularly with your tutor to ensure that you are making progress.

Will I need to study or practise outside the classroom? You will be expected to practise skills and prepare and plan for future sessions. Your tutor will give you guidance on group and individual topics.

What will I need to take to the course? Please bring a pen, notepad and file for your portfolio.

What additional resources will I need? You will need to provide your own timber.
