- Rinsing, fixing, and drying Cyanotype prints

How will I be assessed?

This course is designed to be a fun and informative experience for parents and children. There are no formal assessments, but formative assessments will be done through observations and participation in activities.

Who is this course for?

This course is designed for families and parents/carers who want to explore a fun and engaging art activity together with their children.

Progression Opportunities:

After completing this workshop, participants can explore more advanced alternative photographic processes like Van Dyke Brown printing or Salt Printing. Numerous online tutorials and resources are available for further learning

This workshop can be a stepping stone towards various creative careers or act as an enriching hobby:

- Fine Art Photographer: Gain a foundational understanding of alternative photographic processes often used by fine art photographers.
- Craft Artist: Explore incorporating Cyanotype prints into handmade cards, journals, or mixed media artwork.
- Art Educator: Learn a new and engaging technique to introduce children and adults to the wonders of photography.
- Personal Creative Development: Discover a fun and rewarding way to express your creativity and capture memories in a unique way.
