This workshop utilises a formative assessment approach. Through active participation in discussions, game design exercises, and playtesting sessions, the instructor will provide ongoing feedback to guide and enhance the creative process.

Please bring a notepad, and pen to each session. You may wish to bring a file for any handouts. A laptop with internet access is required for completion of coursework and home learning outside of the classroom.
